Welcome and Introduction

The Chair, on behalf of the AFBI Board, opened the meeting with a word of welcome and stated that, as with last year's event, he was delighted to see such a large turnout including a number of elected representatives, industry and government stakeholders.

Last year the Chair had highlighted the importance of the Agri-Food industry to local economy which had been illustrated in the Agri-Food Strategy Board's "Going for Growth" report. While the last year had proven to be a difficult time for the Agri-Food industry, the Chair stated that many experts expect the current situation to improve in the medium term and, despite the current

situation, it is felt that there will still be opportunities for the Agri-Food industry to expand in an environmentally sustainable manner through effective applied research to drive innovation.

Although this view may appear counterintuitive given the recent announcement of cuts to AFBI's work programme, the Chair informed attendees that the severe pressures on public finances, which is likely to increase in the short to medium term, had forced AFBI to critically examine the most important elements to delivering its mission. The Chair stated that, collectively we must all become smarter in how we fund Agri-Food research to preserve scientific capacity in order to maintain a vibrant industry and for its part, AFBI will continue to aggressively target funding opportunities locally, nationally and internationally whilst continuing to make efforts to reduce its running costs.

In his closing remarks, the Chair informed attendees that the AFBI Board had met with a number of stakeholders over the last year and that they will be very keen to hear attendees views later today on how we can work together to provide world class science in support of the Agri-Food industry.

Report from the CEO

The CEO commenced his presentation with an overview of AFBI's role, structure and main activities as well as providing some background to the reasons behind the direction and aim of AFBI's 2020 strategy. In particular the CEO highlighted that, due to severe pressures on public finances and a major reduction in funding from DARD and other NICS departments, AFBI and DARD had worked closely over the past year to prioritise elements of the DARD work programme. With that in mind, AFBI's 2020 strategy illustrates AFBI's aim to "Shrink to Grow" from the following strategic scientific pillars:

- 1. Animal Health
- 2. Sustainable Livestock Systems
- 3. Plant Health and Crop Science
- 4. Food Safety: Microbiological and chemical
- 5. Environmental Protection
- 6. Fisheries and Aquatic Ecosystems
- 7. Agricultural and Food Economics

After detailing a number of changes to AFBI's work programme, the CEO concluded by informing attendees of a number of initiatives aimed at ensuring that AFBI has the right structure and internal mechanisms in place going forward. These will allow the Institute to increase its collaborations with universities and research organisations on both the national and international stage which will in turn allow AFBI to maximise its ability to avail of research funding opportunities.
