We are not obliged under section 22 of the FOIA to provide information that is intended for future publication. In line with the terms of this exemption, we have considered whether it would be in the public interest for us to provide you with the information ahead of publication, despite the exemption being applicable. In this case, we have concluded that the public interest favours withholding the information.

When assessing whether or not it was in the public interest to disclose the information to you, we took into account the following factors:

Public interest considerations favouring disclosure

Disclosure would improve transparency in the operations of AFBI.

 Disclosure of the information under FOIA would be consistent with the Institute's commitment to proactively publish data on matters of a wider public interest.

Public interest considerations favouring withholding the information

- As the information is of interest to the wider public it is important it can be
 accessed simultaneously by the general public rather than piecemeal by
 disclosure to a small number of individuals under the FOIA. Therefore it is in
 the wider interest that information is accessible to the wider public by
 adhering to the publication schedule.
- The evaluation of the two documents is going through the standard internal
 quality assurance checks and they may be subject to further revision before
 publication. It is in the public interest that the quality assurance process is
 able to conclude before making information available to the public to ensure
 confidence and accuracy in the information disclosed.
- The Learning & Development Strategy directly affects AFBI's staff members and senior management would prefer this document to be launched to them in the first instance prior to release into the public domain.

We reached the view that, on balance, the public interest is better served by withholding this information under section 22 of the FOIA at this time.
