



## **MANAGEMENT NOTES:**

- Despite high rainfall during the last week soil temperatures have risen by 1.9°C which has improved grass growth across the province.
- Where grass covers are high and with grass growth increasing, it is important to get livestock turned out as soon possible.
- Where ground conditions are marginal options such as back fencing or turning out lighter stock first should be considered.
- Spring grass quality is high and the potential for high animal performance should not be underestimated.
- The projection for the coming fortnight reflects poorer weather forecasts.
