Toxicology results were first reported on 23/08/13, with re-testing in 2014 and a second report on 07/04/14' i.e. i. Were the toxicology results for both birds reported on the 23/8/13? ii. Which bird(s) were retested? iii. Why was the retest done?	i. A sea eagle and a buzzard suspected of having been shot or poisoned were submitted to AFBI's Veterinary Sciences Division by the PSNI on 30 April 2013. The cause of death of the buzzard was determined at gross port-mortem examination and reported. Samples taken were submitted to the Science and Advice for Scottish Agriculture (SASA) in early May for pesticides analysis. Gizzard contents from the eagle were found positive for carbofuran. These results were reported to the PSNI on the 23 August 2013 but unfortunately they were wrongly assigned to the buzzard samples. This was an administrative error and measures have been put in place to minimise the likelihood of this happening again. ii. Sea Eagle. iii. On 28 January 2014 the PSNI requested further tests on the sea eagle and a liver sample was submitted to SASA.

Clarification of the text "The cause of death of the buzzard was determined at gross port-mortem examination and reported" which was stated in the response to FOI request AFBIFOI20141001.	gross port-mortem examination. The cause of death of the buzzard was probably starvation following a wing fracture. The shot pellets (one in the head and one near the pelvis) probably originated from an old wound, healed by the time of death.  2. The positive carbofuran results wrongly assigned to the buzzard were submitted to the Wildlife Incident Investigation Scheme for including within their online reports.

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	3. A new submission for the quarterly reports to WIIS has been made from AFBI and the rectification of the results for case 2013-10574 has been included.
