"Purple Magic" potatoes

New potato variety from AFBI Loughgall

Purple Magic, one of the newest potato varieties from Crops, Grassland and Ecology Branch, AFBI Loughgall, is becoming well established in Canada and USA. Although it has only completed registration in 2015, already over a thousand tonnes of seed have been produced in Canada.

As its name suggests, the variety has bright purple skin and purple colouration in the tubers. Although no claims are being made about its health-promoting qualities, it contains high levels of anthocyanins similar to those found in blueberries. This builds on the already healthy potato by including antioxidants normally associated with berries along with vitamin C, minerals and fibre.

Control of liver fluke and rumen fluke infection in sheep and cattle in Northern Ireland

Each year in Northern Ireland, the onset of autumn marks the beginning of the 'fluke season' with the death and debility affecting sheep on farms across the province, as liver fluke burdens become established in animals that have grazed on pasture contaminated with the infective metacercarial cysts
