Title: Species and Environmental Modelling

Session description:

Data collection and modelling, whether it be oceanographic or mobile fauna, is an integral part of all three projects. The goal of this session is to discuss how the projects can work more collaboratively to improve the quality and quantity of data being collected as well as the modelling tools being used. Title: Marine Management Plans and Protected Areas

Session description:

The development of MPA management plans provides a mechanism for bringing together relevant stakeholders to discuss our existing knowledge alongside the new research outputs from MarPAMM, COMPASS and SeaMonitor, with a view to identifying options and recommendations for the management of relevant MPAs.
