What is Horizon 2020?



- •EC's latest 7 year programme for Research and Innovation successor to the FP7 programme
- •The biggest EU research programme ever with a budget of approx. €78 billion of funding available over 7 years (2014-2020)
- Aims to ensure Europe produces world class science and technology that drives economic growth
- •Coupling research to innovation from research to retail, all forms of innovation
- A competitive fund with no national allocations
- •Simplified access to EU funding for all types of organisations: companies, universities, charities, public bodies and institutes in all EU countries and beyond

Horizon 2020 – Focus and Key Features

- •Greater focus on:
 - •Societal challenges facing EU society e.g. health, clean energy, transport, etc.
 - •SME's
 - •the impacts & outcomes of research compared to FP7
- •Dealing with **Climate Change** a cross cutting priority in Horizon 2020 accounts for 35% of the overall budget across the programme.
- •At least 60% of overall budget should be related to **Sustainable Development**
- •Generous funding rates of up to 125%
 - Up to 100% of the value of the project and an additional 25% to cover directly linked business overheads
- •Horizon 2020 will not fund:
 - •Community projects, or community groups, to carry out solely localised activities
 - Employment creation schemes
 - Small scale individual projects

Horizon 2020 - Three Pillars

When launched in December 2013, the EC released a number of Work Programmes covering 2014 / 2015 under the three main pillars as follows:

Excellent Science

Horizon 2020 will boost the EU's position as a world leader in science, attracting the best brains and helping our scientists collaborate and share ideas across Europe.

Industrial Leadership

To be best at what it does, Europe needs to invest in promising and strategic technologies and encourage businesses to invest more in research and innovation.

Better Society


The EU has identified seven priority challenges where targeted investment in research and innovation can have a real impact on benefitting the citizen.


H2020 Framework



Who may apply?

•Horizon 2020 is open to everyone with only one set of simplified rules and procedures to follow.


For Standard Research Projects:

- A consortium of at least three legal entities
- •Each entity must be established in an EU Member State or an associated country.

•For other Programmes:

- •European Research Council (ERC), SME Instrument, co-funding of national or public sector calls or programmes, coordination and support, training and mobility,
- Minimum condition for participation is one legal entity established in a Member State or in an Associated Country
- •Other conditions may apply check work programme for further details.

Finding partners and raising your profile

- Make the most of established networks you are involved in and people you have worked with before
- Attend workshops, EU Information days and brokerage events
- Review partners searches on EU and National online forums
 - EU Cordis, LINKEDIN, EPA Online Catalogue, InterTrade Ireland and NCP CaRE
 - Alternatively Sign up on for the DAERA EU Funding team or EPA mailing list
- Write a 1-2 page summary of interests, project areas and calls you would like to get involved with and post on sites
- Get involved with key EU platforms
- Success breeds success look on Commissions' H2020 site to see who and what type of projects have been funded in the past

Join the database of independent experts for European research and innovation.

The European Commission appoints independent experts to assist with research and innovation assignments including the evaluation of proposals, monitoring of projects, and evaluation of programmes, and design of policy.

Who can be an expert?

You have a chance of being selected as an expert if you:

- have high-level of expertise in the relevant fields of research and innovation (see call for details on types of expertise).
- can be available for occasional, short-term assignments

What do expert assignments involve?

Experts, as peer reviewers, assist in the:

- evaluation of proposals
- · monitoring of actions

In addition, experts assist in the :

 preparation, implementation or evaluation of programmes and design of policies. This includes the Horizon 2020 Advisory Groups.

Assignments mainly concern research and innovation, falling within the Horizon 2020 programme designed to address the challenges Europe is facing through funding excellent science, technology and innovation.

Take a look at the most recently funded projects.

Business innovation coaches support SMEs funded via the SME instrument. An expression of interest for experts willing to become Business Innovation Coach for the SME instrument is available on the EASME website. Candidate coaches will also be asked to provide more detailed information on their competence and experience here.

In order to access the expert registration form, you are first asked to login with a valid Participant Portal (ECAS)

Support available from the NI Contact Point Network

- Established in 2013 the Horizon 2020 NICP network is a resource available to all potential NI applicants free of charge
- Coordinated by DETI there are now 12 NI based NICP'S and 2 Brussels based
- Type of support available from NI Contact Point Officers:
 - •Thematic expertise on relevant calls and advice on project ideas
 - Assistance with the application process
 - **Dissemination** of relevant information through events and one to one meetings
 - Proactively seek relevant opportunities for academics & business to collaborate
 - •Help to find potential **partners**, within the same sector or, through the network in complementary areas
 - Provide links to UK and Irish National Contact Points (NCPs)





Financial support available for NI applicants

INVESTNI

- •Project Definition Grants Up to £15k
 - •Available to researchers and companies in NI with a clear project idea who are committed to the preparation of Horizon 2020 or other collaborative project applications.
 - •Eligible costs can include; internal labour costs; flights and accommodation for meeting with EU partners; consultancy support for proposal writing/review and IP support.

Cross-Border Innovation Vouchers

- Both Invest NI & Enterprise Ireland Innovation Voucher Schemes are open to Horizon 2020 participants from industry to explore potential partnerships with Knowledge Providers based in their own jurisdiction or in the opposite jurisdiction.
- •A voucher is worth £4000 or €5000.

Support available from InterTrade Ireland

- Horizon 2020 Guides
- Horizon 2020 Smart Phone App
- EU Travel Scheme
 - Supports established North South partnerships to travel off the island
 - Up to £350/€455 (per event) awarded to each partner to attend Consortium Meetings, European Commission Information Days and Brokerage Events
 - Only one partner is required to travel to any event
- Cross Border Innovation Vouchers
 - •Up to £500/€650 per applicant and valid for up to 6 months
 - •Covers travel and accommodation costs incurred when meeting a partner in the opposite jurisdiction
- North South Competitive Partnerships Programme for Horizon 2020
 - Review service provided by INI of past N/S applications which didn't receive funding





DAERA support available

- NICPs for SC5 and SC2, EU Funding Team and Brussels based Liaison Officer
 - Small team (2) based in DAERA Environmental Policy Division, one in AFBI and 2 in Brussels
 - Strong links with ROI, UK and key EU Networks
 - Support available:
 - •the provision of advice and information,
 - reviewing applications,
 - developing contact networks,
 - providing letters of support,
 - circulation of funding calls and partners searches.

NI Target and Success to date

- NI Target to draw down €145m over the life of the programme
- NI Target to increase successful NI/ROI participation and secure €175m
- For calls up to November 2015 (snap shot of preliminary main listed figures):
 - €28.6m secured from 76 successful participations involving 67 separate project proposals
 - 712 eligible NI participants submitted **627 applications** similar to FP7
 - 23 with NI project coordinators
 - €28.6m in funding over 76 projects NI average £376k per project
 - Successful applications Universities (65.8%), Private sector (13.2 %), Public Bodies
 (13.2%) and Research Organisations (5.3%)
 - SME's accounted for 13.2% of successful applications and 17.1% of total NI value
 - 10.67% success rate for NI (UK 14.41%)
 - JULY 15 Over **47%** (**€7.3m**) of NI success involved **NI/ROI collaborations** average drawdown per project **€**440k (25% more than NI average)
- •Following recent success NI participants total funding secured now €52.1m
 - €28.6m from main listed projects and €23.5m from IMI success achieved by QUB
